Osaka Prefecture - the <u>political</u>, economic, cultural and transportation center of the Kinki region and even the entire Western Japan

Osaka Prefecture is the political, economic, cultural and transportation center of the Kinki region and even the entire Western Japan, where the most region is highly urbanized, forming multiple major metropolitan areas (Osaka Metropolitan Area, Hanshin Metropolitan Area (Japanese: ハンシンメトロポリス), Keihanshin Metropolitan Area) with Osaka City as the center. The total population of Osaka Prefecture (8.78 million people) is the third highest in Japan behind Tokyo Metropolis and Kanagawa Prefecture; its population density ranks the second in Japan, only next to Tokyo Metropolis; and its GDP is the second highest in Japan, only next to Tokyo Metropolis.

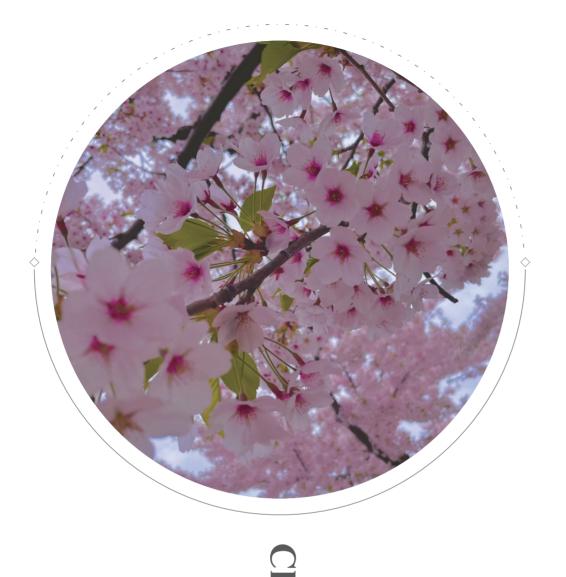
In ancient Japan, Osaka served as the terminal station for the SetoNaikai route. According to the records of Ancient Legends and The Nihon Shoki, numerous emperors of the Yamato period located their palace or capital in the present Osaka Prefecture.

One of the oldest temples in Japan, Shitennoji Temple (Tennoji Ward, Osaka), was built by the Emperor Suiko in 593 A.D. In December 645 A.D., the Emperor Kotoku relocated the capital and built the Namba Fengqi Shrine in the Osaka Prefecture. Afterwards, the Emperor Shomu also established the Namba Shrine here, and it was considered as the alternate capital of Japan for a long time since then.

During the Heian period, a water transport connection to Kyoto was established through the Yodo River mouth. The rich maritime history has also laid a solid foundation for Osaka's present prosperity in sea transportation.



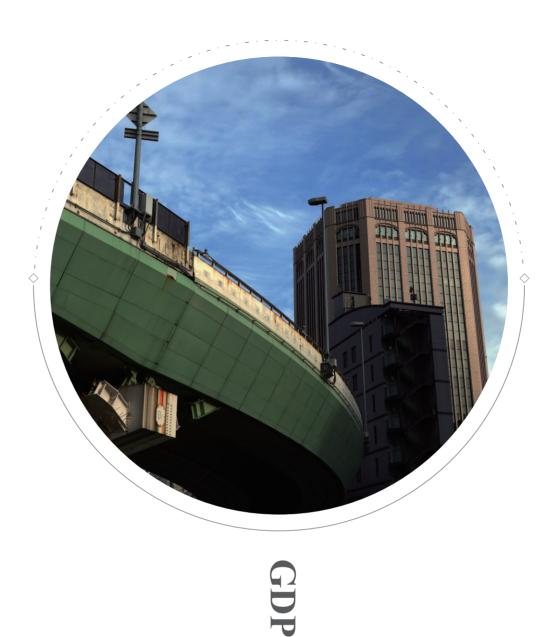




Geographic Location

Osaka Prefecture is located in the central part of the Kinki region of Honshu island, bordering on Kyoto Prefecture, Nara Prefecture, Hyogo Prefecture and Wakayama Prefecture. Since ancient times, Osaka Prefecture has been the center of waterway transportation in Japan. Osaka Bay is located in the southwestern Osaka Prefecture. Osaka Prefecture covers an area of 1,905.14 square kilometers [equals to 1.71 times the size of Hong Kong's land (1,114 square kilometers)]. The prefecture is divided into 24 wards: Naniwa Ward, Nishinari Ward, Minato Ward, Konohana Ward, Nishiyodogawa Ward, Higashiyodogawa Ward, Higashinari Ward, Tennoji Ward and Sumiyoshi Ward, etc., among which Chuo Ward is the site of the prefectural office and Kita Ward the municipal office.

The entire Osaka Prefecture has a SetoNaikai climate with mild weather and few rainy days throughout the year. The tropical island effect is evident in the downtown area and the temperature does not easily drop at night. The accumulation of snow is not significant in winter and in many areas the snow cover is only a few centimeters.

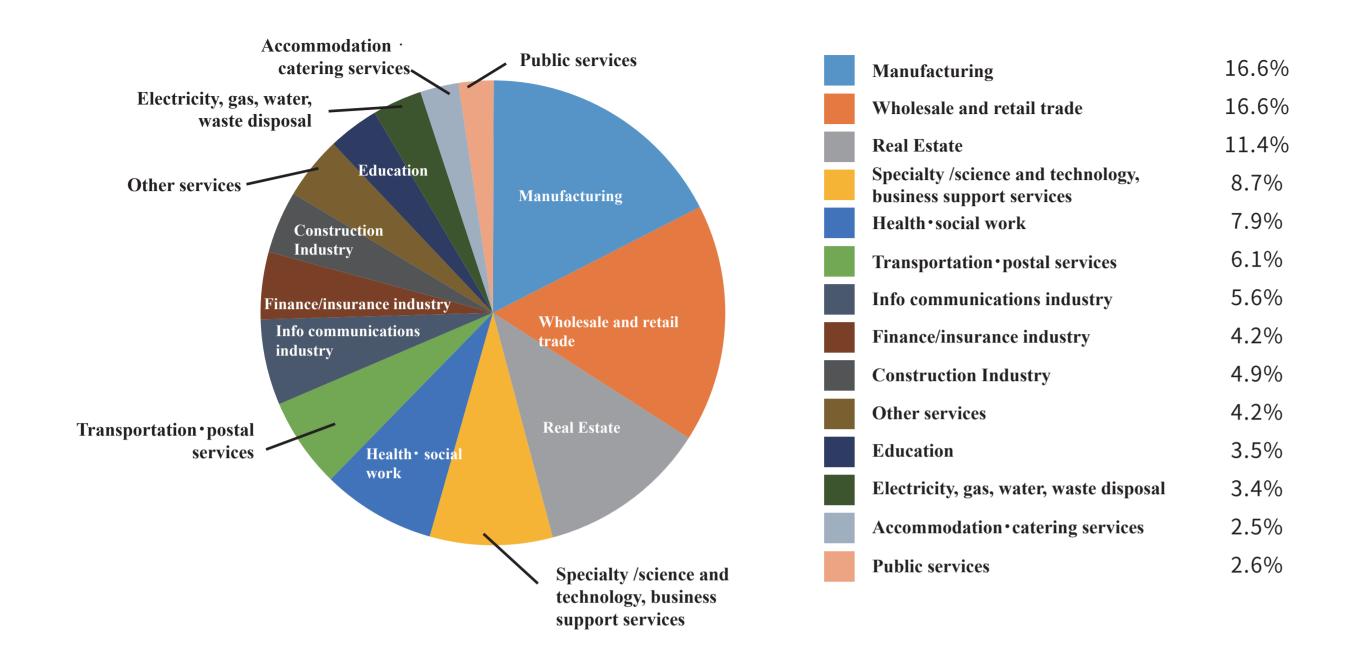




Economic ctivities

According to the World Poulation Review, Osaka ranks 7th among the world's richest cities in 2022, with a GDP value of USD 654.8 billion (654.8B), falling behind London and Paris. Osaka's own diverse and mature economic activities have also brought economic competitiveness to the city.

The Kinki region is located in the central and western part of Honshu and is the second most important industrial area in Japan, especially known for its chemicals, machineries, steel and metals. Both the Tokaido Shinkansen and the Sanyo Shinkansen depart from and arrive at the Shin-Osaka Station (except for some trains from Tokyo to Hakata, Kyushu or Hiroshima). Osaka is the financial and industrial center of the western Japan. It is also very diversified in terms of its rich production in rice, citrus fruits, timber and fishing.

In the fields of electrical equipment, pharmaceuticals, food, chemicals, and finance, there are always multinational companies with their head offices in Kansai. 52 of the top 500 companies listed in FORTUNE magazine (2018 edition) are Japanese enterprises, seven of which have their head offices in Osaka.

Trade

Osaka has made full and effective use of Hanshin Port, a major port in Japan with strong container handling capacity.

Whether for foreign trade or domestic trade, Hanshin Port has the top container handling capacity among the major domestic ports in Japan and performs an excellent port function.





Osaka-Kansai Expo

This is the World Expo scheduled to be held in Osaka, Japan in 2025.

The World Expo 2025, also known as Osaka-Kansai World Expo, is a comprehensive World Expo to be held in Osaka, Japan in 2025 and is recognized by the International Exhibitions Bureau. The main venue is scheduled to be located on the artificial island "Yumeshima" in Konohana Ward, Osaka and the duration of the expo will be 6 months. This is the second time that a World Expo is held in Osaka. Previously, the 1970 World Expo was hosted in Suita, Osaka Prefecture, a suburb of Osaka. The construction cost of the venue for the Osaka Expo is expected to be about 125 billion yen (approximately RMB 7.7 billion).

Economic benefits created by the World Expo

Consumption has a reverse effect on production and the development of consumption promotes the development of production. By hosting the World Expo, it will greatly expand domestic investment and consumption demand and boost the development of related industries such as tourism, cultural industry, catering, communication and transportation, thus effectively driving the growth of the national economy.

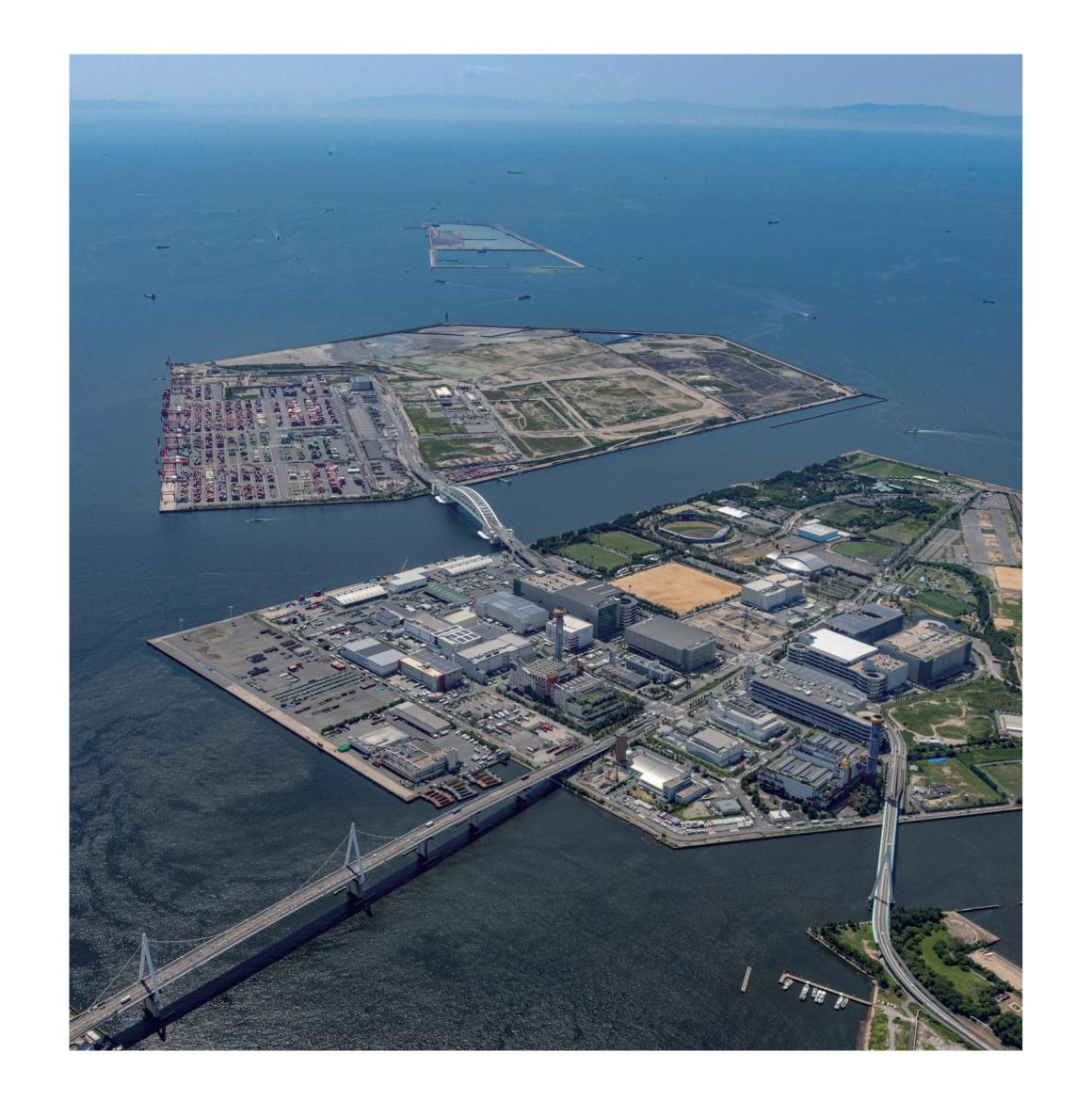
In addition to boosting the local economy, the World Expo can bring a lot of consumer power to promote economic growth. The number of visitors to the 2010 World Expo in Shanghai, China was 73.09 million, of which the economic benefits driven by foot traffic can be imagined. According to official figures, the number of visitors to 1970 World Expo in Osaka was 64.22 million.

At the same time, holding the World Expo is conducive to promoting the country's independent innovation and the optimization and upgrading of industrial institutions; the concept of achieving harmonious and sustainable development in urban areas will also promote the transformation of the economic development mode and improve the capacity for sustainable development.











The Resort of Osaka Casino project has been finalized at <u>"Yumeshima"</u>, an artificial island in Konohana Ward, Osaka.

The government ultimately selected MGM Resorts International (the largest resort facility in the United States) and ORIX Group (Japan's first rental company) to jointly develop and operate the Yumeshima Casino in Osaka. The Osaka Governor, Yoshimura, said at a press conference on the 28th, "It is rarely seen in Japan nowadays to invest 1 trillion yen (about RMB 50 billion) in one project, and we will aim to build the world's highest level IR (Integrated Resorts)."

The economic power from the gaming industry **≥**

The initial investment is said to be 1 trillion and 80 billion yen. The number of visitors is expected to be 20.5 million per year and the economic benefits are anticipated to be over 760 billion yen per year. The Osaka Casino will also create approximately 15,000 jobs and make a great contribution to Osaka's economic development. Osaka's investment outlook – prosperous and promising.

The close relationship between the gaming industry and real estate The top 4 gaming cities in the world have all brought a fast growth in local housing prices.











Macao

MacaoMacao casinos have allowed Macao's housing prices to skyrocket more than 20 times within 10 years. The simultaneous development of casinos, economy and housing prices has made Macao the No.1 gambling city in Southeast Asia. Macao, the Las Vegas of Asia, is only 29.5 square kilometers in size and has a population of 607,500, but the vitality of this small city stands out with a thriving gaming industry.

Along with development of the gaming industry, the local GDP of Macao is also growing at a very fast speed.

"Macao's housing prices are ridiculously expensive," is the most honest opinion of many Macao locals. In the past 10 years, Macao's housing prices have risen wildly along with its gaming revenue, with a cumulative increase of nearly 20 times.

Today, Macao's housing prices have caught up with those of Hong Kong. With casinos taking the lead, tourism, hospitality and recreation areas have made Macao much prosperous and one of the most developed and affluent regions in the world

Las Vegas

Las Vegas casinos can attract more than 40 million visitors each year. For three consecutive years, the increase of housing prices have been more than 10% and the growth rate has shot up to the second highest in the entire United States. The reputation of gambling city alone, with over 40 million visitors a year, can create an insurmountable myth for the housing prices. At the same time, the Las Vegas has an excellent rental market, ranking top in the entire United States, with a high return on investment, which strengthens investors' determination to enter into it.

Monaco

Monaco is a typical micro-state, which is the second smallest country in the world, second only to the Vatican. Its land area is not as large as a random county in China. But such a small and seemingly insignificant country ranks first in the world's wealthy cities.

Monaco's highly developed tourism and gaming industry attract tens of thousands of people to visit there every year. Although it is a small country with a small population, the large tourist population keeps Monaco's economic income at a high level all year round. The high standard of per capita income also sets the high index of local housing prices.

Monaco, without any poor man, is one of the few cities in the world without slums, whose housing prices have been ranked first in the world for the ninth consecutive year. The local housing prices are about RMB 320,000 per square meters, which means with 1 million dollars you can only buy a luxury house of 17 m2 in Monaco.

Singapore

Casinos have boosted tourism in Singapore by 25% within 4 years, while before 2010 Singapore's tourism industry was far less developed than it is today. The few tourism selling points cannot become a key industry in the city because of its single pattern and lack of consumer momentum.

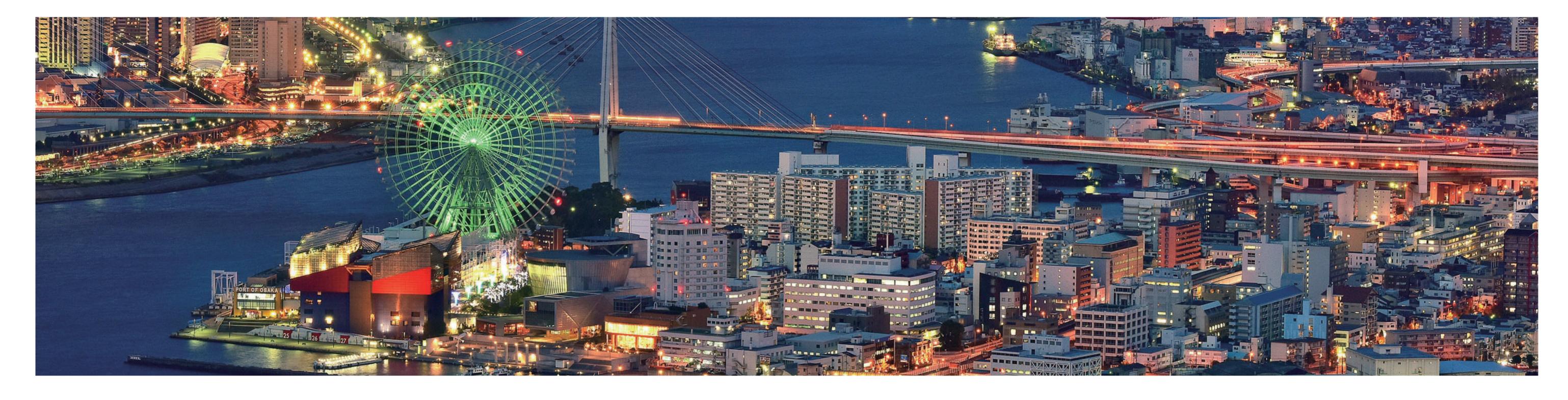
In 2010, the Sand Casino was completed and opened for business, making Singapore a concentration of gambling and recreation industries in Southeast Asia. In just a few years, the tourism industry has a profit of more than 30% and owns its special selling points. Singapore is no longer a stopover for Thailand and Bali, but a major tourist powerhouse with a strong capacity to contain tourists.

Today, the recreation industry, proliferated and developed around gambling, has become the backbone of Singapore's tourism and also a major influence in the rise of housing prices in Singapore. The government's open-door policy has also made Singapore's housing prices grow fast, accompanied by the rapid development of the gaming industry.

Japan

Throughout the world's traditional gambling cities, the power of gaming has a significant effect on a city.

Osaka is now deservedly in the spotlight in Japan as it is the site of the first batch of integrated casino resorts in this country. The world-class casino is sure to be the new center of the gaming industry in Asia.



Tourism



The number of foreign visitors to Osaka has increased rapidly in recent years. According to the annual "Ranking List of Rapidly Growing Cities Visited by Overseas People" published by a major U.S. credit card company, Osaka's average increase over the past eight years has been the highest in the world for two consecutive years in 2016 and 2017, having a tendency to exceed Japan's capital, i.e. Tokyo. And why is Osaka now so popular with overseas visitors? Let's analyze why Osaka is so attractive to tourists.

According to information released by the Japan National Tourism Organization (JNTO), the number of overseas visitors to Japan in 2018 reached 31,192,000, an increase of 8.7% over the previous year, which is the highest value since the statistics began in 1964. In addition to the relaxation of visa restrictions in Japan, the popularity of low-cost flights and the devaluation of Japanese currency, the main factor is that the number of foreigners visiting Osaka has increased at a rate that is among the highest in the world, with the number of visitors in 2017 being 4.2 times higher than five years ago.

Osaka's bustling business areas are concentrated near Umeda (commonly known as the Kita-ku), near Namba (commonly known as the Nam-gu) and Tennoji Temple, each of which is in close distance to the other, forming a tight-knit city. The four most popular attractions for foreigners to visit in Osaka (Osaka Castle, Dotonbori, Universal Studios in Osaka, and Kaiyukan) can be reached by the well-connected railway, not only cheap, but also fast and efficient, which is very important for travelers whose time is precious. In addition, Osaka has a strong advantage in terms of easy access to popular ancient cities such as Kyoto and Nara. In fact, wherever you go from Kansai Airport, you will first pass through Osaka, which is the great advantage of this city.

The total number of overseas visitors to Japan from January to December, 2019 was 31,882,000 prior to the pandemic, an increase of 2.2% compared to 2018. Among which, the number of Chinese visitors to Japan increased by 14.5%. The top 5 visitors to Japan are Korea, Taiwan, China, Hong Kong and the United States.

The data released by the Osaka Prefectural Government shows that the number of foreign travelers to Osaka is 12,306,000. This figure is a direct indication that Osaka is popular with these tourists, with 38 out of every 100 people visiting Osaka, Japan, which is already more than 1/3.

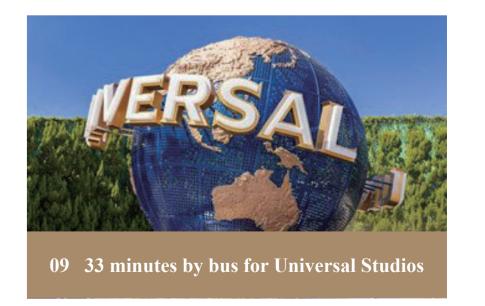












Project site
